The issue was resolved and portable changeable signage was installed on 12<sup>th</sup> Street and Texas Drive. KCRC is coordinating with Texas Township on Phase 1; the installation of the sewer system on Texas Drive.

Commissioner Moyle thanked staff for the excellent job on the 2010 Annual Report saying it was "first class". Finance Director Benison replied Accountant Diane DeWaters did most of the work on the report.

Commissioner Maddox asked if any follow up had been done from the Joint Meeting with Cooper Township regarding the 12<sup>th</sup> Street project and speed limits on that road. Managing Director Johnson advised the Board no action is necessary as the meeting is a work session to provide the Board members feedback on the items listed on the agenda. She thanked the department heads for their efforts preparing for the work session.

- A. **Fund Balance Policy Review** Finance Director Benison provided an overview of the policy. Commissioner Oscarson inquired if the categories were used would they be reflected on the financial statements. Finance Director Benison answered yes. Commissioner Maddox questioned reasons for having policies or using the categories, if not necessary. Commissioner Oscarson requested the two-thirds requirement be reviewed, and reflected as an actual number in the Authority to Commit.
- B. Purchasing Policy Review Commissioner Berkebile would like staff to consider adding a Michigan Based vendor reference within the policy. Commissioner Moyle requested staff have a better system for reviewing outstanding purchases at year end using the purchase order system. Commissioner Maddox inquired on the purchasing order limit of \$1,500. Commissioner Moyle questioned how we are aware of purchases below the \$750 or \$1,500 limit. General Superintendent Bartholomew noted through packing slips and Finance Director Benison advised when an invoice is received, also noting typically these purchase are made either on account or with the credit card and only certain staff have the ability to make such purchases. Mrs. Benison advised we are still working on other purchasing areas including bid bonds, the disposal of items, and purchasing at auctions. Managing Director Johnson advised the tables for the Maintenance Building were purchased at an auction. Commissioner McCauley requested adding the ability of other municipal agencies to participate in our purchasing. Commissioner McCauley also inquired if the Kalamazoo County Road Commission (KCRC) had to continue advertising in newspapers and Finance Director Benison responded yes. Managing Director Johnson explained the purchasing area is an area in which the road commission continues to seek collaborative efforts.

### C. Technology Policies Review

- 1. **Non-Privacy, Monitoring, and Electronic Communication** Managing Director Johnson reviewed the currently policy. Commissioner Berkebile commented that several sentences in the draft policy are in conflict with one another, and does not address the ability of staff to check personal emails and voicemails from our system.
- 2. **Social Media** Managing Director Johnson reviewed the social media policy. She also commented the County Road Association of Michigan (CRAM) has suggested every road commission have a Facebook page. Commissioner McCauley stated the website provides valuable information to the public and serves the purpose of communication.
- D. **Telephone System Review** Finance Director Benison provided an update of current status of this project, including our partnership with the City of Kalamazoo giving her appreciation for all of the assistance and cooperation from the City. Commissioner Maddox commented that in the future organizations will be working from wireless and cell phone technology.

- E. Sheriff Collaboration/Weighmaster Managing Director Johnson provided a status update. She also advised Commissioner Oscarson has been part of the process and presentations on the topic. The key area will remain the cooperation and support from the Townships to fund the program with citation fines to the Sheriff. Mrs. Johnson advised the KCRC would take lead on the efforts if the Board continued to support it. Commissioner Maddox suggested each Board member contact their respective townships with support of the program and get their feedback. Commissioner Maddox inquired on which townships had not adopted the UTC. Mrs. Johnson responded only a few had not and she would follow up with specifics. Commissioner Berkebile questioned if the Sheriff was in support of the program and would it be supported financially with only a \$31,000 contribution from the KCRC. Commissioner Oscarson responded yes with support coming through fines collected which hopefully would make the program self-sustaining. Commissioner Berkebile stated he is in support as it protects our roads. Managing Director Johnson suggested that because the feedback is positive, she would like to consult the sheriff's office to work out a plan to move forward.

Commissioner Berkebile noted that purchase orders ranging from \$1,500.00 to \$4,000.00 require having at least three (3) quotes but the policy doesn't state a number of required bids for sealed bids greater than \$15,000.00. He suggested this issue be revisited for possible updates and better consistency.

He went on to say each employee is valuable and should be given the best insurance possible at the least cost. Commissioner Oscarson was in favor of a cap on the amount the road commission pays for health insurance as the amount would be fixed and easier to budget. Staff will work with our insurance agent for potential alternatives and get better direction as to the impact of benefit-plan changes and present this information at a future Board meeting.

The Board reviewed the retiree health insurance benefits.

The Board reviewed the proposed Information Technology (IT) Policies Managing Director Johnson noted the auditors, Plante and Moran sent examples of updated policies and Mrs. Johnson explained the policies under review. Representatives from Lakeshore Market, a business located on South Sprinkle Road expressed concerns over the turn lane taper that stops before the driveway entrance to the business and no curbing installed at the drive. The market owner Cheri Craig noted she understood from the pre construction meeting and plan review in April the turn lane taper would extend to the market entrance and there would be curbing installed to Wells Street. She cited a potential safety issue at the curve south of the driveway, cars traveling at high speeds, and drivers unaware the turn lane has ended to turn into their market. Commissioner McCauley advised staff would be available to review the plans and discuss their concerns.

Presentation: The Kalamazoo Area Transportation Study (KATS) Draft Prioritization Process Update was presented by Jon Start, Director. He introduced a proposed new application called a Project Concept Statement and explained the prioritization process and factors that affect it. Commissioner Oscarson had some questions about pro rating in apportioning available federal funds to the appropriate Act 51 Authority as it could end up with one Act 51 Authority getting the majority of the money because their projects become higher priorities. He asked if it was possible to establish a certain percentage that would go to each of the communities. Director Start answered the process is trying to navigate away from allotting certain percentages rather than based on need. Other citizen issues claimed there was no information on the website regarding this issue. The citizens emphatically stated the stone and mortar were not a liability because of the slow speed limit. Several felt their structures should be grandfathered and future requests denied. Some felt they were being singled out because there are so many non conforming mailboxes in Kalamazoo County and it should be administered consistently and fairly. Commissioner Oscarson explained when doing construction in an area and there are non-conforming mailboxes the residents get a letter, adding the Kalamazoo County Road Commission (KCRC) doesn't have the manpower to drive up and down every county road looking for non-conforming mailboxes. He then explained due to the fact the road commission receives federal funds they are obliged to follow American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) standards, which do not allow for these kind of mailbox structures. Liability and insurance claims were also discussed. Commissioner Maddox moved and it was seconded to postpone action for removal, review the current mailbox policy, have the policy as an agenda item for the October 25, 2011 Board Meeting and have citizens provide letters and comments for review. The general nature of the proposed project was discussed and the plans and specification for the project were reviewed, along with the proposed schedule for apportionment of benefit.

Managing Director Johnson read a description the of project Burlington Drive from 1,600' south of C Avenue to 100' north of C Avenue, a total of .32 miles, Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) Overlay. Total estimate=\$35,688.00. The defined district for the special assessment includes 3,154.30 of front footage on Burlington Drive.

Commissioner Berkebile moved and it was seconded to open the public hearing. Carried by the following vote:

A resident, Tom O'Neil of 1212 Burlington Drive inquired about the \$2,000.00 cost for postage, which is more than the petitioned amount. Managing Director Johnson replied property owners will be assessed on actual cost which includes postage and advertising.

A resident, Jim Burhino of 1282 Burlington Drive had questions regarding patches and potholes causing the new road to fail, and water pooling on the roadway. Area Superintendent DeYoung answered all water issues will be looked at prior to paving and added drainage structures will not be added nor will the elevation of the road change.

A resident Bob Ringerman of 1307 Burlington Drive questioned whether water would continue to flow and seep into garages. Area Superintendent DeYoung suggested HMA berms may be used to manage water; however the road design is not changing. Commissioner Oscarson added the road was built through history from gravel and created the existing slope.

Mr. O'Neil inquired about limits of paving, the crown of the road and asked for speed bumps. Managing Director Johnson explained speed bumps would not be installed as they interfere with maintenance and speeding is a result of driver behavior. Mr. O'Neil had a complaint regarding response time for winter snow plowing which he stated has taken up to three weeks.

Citizens inquired about the duration of the project. Superintendent DeYoung responded there would be one day to mill and one day to pave but they may not be done congruently and all weather permitting.

A resident Sid Durham of 1348 Burlington Drive asked how many years the assessment is for and what will the percentage of the contribution. Managing Director Johnson advised the final cost will be

calculated and sent to the Township. Commissioner Berkebile explained the Board is willing to split the assessment to what homeowners prefer. The assessment will be spread for two years with interest.

Mr. O'Neil asked if the road could be abandoned. Managing Director Johnson referred Mr. O'Neil to the Kalamazoo County Road Commission website for the abandonment petition process.

Commissioner Berkebile moved and it was seconded to receive the correspondence for Kalamazoo County Road Commission Encroachment and/or Obstruction and Accommodation of Mailboxes and Newspaper Delivery Boxes on County Road Right of Way Policies for consideration in new business and refer to file.

Carried by the following vote:

Aye: McCauley, Oscarson, Berkebile, Moyle

Residents of Westport Plat, Oshtemo Township voiced their objection to letters they received regarding removal of their non-conforming mailbox structures.

Commissioner Oscarson explained:

Encroachments can be boulders, pipes, concrete blocks and basketball hoops within the 33 foot right of way

- The concept of grandfathering existing structures will cause a debate with citizens wanting new structures, questioning why it will not be allowed
- The American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) and the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) require the county road commissions meet their requirements to receive funding
- Where to draw the line [structure size and materials] if the policy were to change
- A letter from an insurance agent was received stating if a street is private the road commission has no jurisdiction over the right of way and the citizens of Westport can petition for roads in the Westport plat to become private but the residents would be responsible for their own snow plowing and road maintenance
- The policy is to deal with encroachments as the road commission becomes aware of them
  and the road commission was made aware of encroachments in the Westport neighborhood;
  adding there is not the manpower to patrol the county roads looking for encroachments
- Concern for the safety of residents as well as snowplow drivers hitting a permanent structure and the liability of the road commission
- Several seminars he attended addressed setting speed limits and the hazard of speed bumps to the snow plowing operation
- Masonry mailboxes costing \$2500.00-\$3000.00 are far too expensive to replace if they need to be removed for a road/sewer project
- All drivers don't obey a 25 mph speed limit and enforcement is not a top priority for the Sheriff Department thus slower speed limits are not a guarantee there will be no serious accidents

Commissioner Berkebile stated he is in favor of keeping the current Encroachment and/or Obstruction and Accommodation of Mailboxes and Newspaper Delivery Boxes on County Road Right of Way Policy as is; noting the Road Commission Board was appointed by the County Commission to be the guardian of the right of way in Kalamazoo County. He added the Michigan Court System as well as the Supreme Court have upheld the Encroachment/Obstruction and Accommodation Policies when challenged in court. Commissioner Berkebile noted because a speed limit is 25 mph does not mean that is the speed all motorists are traveling and if someone speeding hits a permanent structure in the right of way which is in the control of the Kalamazoo County Road Commission (KCRC) the road commission is liable. Commissioner Berkebile continued he was not in favor of having the mailbox included in the homeowner's policy as there would be no way to administer as policies can easily be changed.

Commissioner Moyle explained road commissions are being asked to do more with less funding, questioning who would administer a permit system or insurance policy. He continued saying during the time he has been on the board there have been several encroachment issues brought to their attention which were addressed consistent to policy. He also stated getting equipment down roads for maintenance requires turning or removing mailboxes; with permanent mailbox structures this is not possible.

Commissioner McCauley suggested citizens form a focus group, with their townships, and draft a policy for review. He said there will be a need for a sewer project within the next ten years and if mailboxes are removed for a project they are replaced with standard conforming mailboxes. Replacement of non-conforming mailboxes after a project is complete will be at the homeowner's expense. He expressed concern over size limitations and construction materials. He agreed to have staff educate landscapers, builders and township officials on the encroachment policy.

In response to lowering the speed limit Commissioner McCauley explained it was out of county road commission hands as speed limits are mandated by the Michigan State Police and speed bumps are hazards for snow plowing.

Commissioner Berkebile moved and it was seconded to make no decision at this time and postpone enforcing letters that have already been sent out until February 1, 2012. Staff will research new standards, if any, for mailboxes that may be permitted other than the standard 4 by 4 post which is the current United State Postal Service (USPS) and AASHTO guidelines. Staff will seek feedback from township representatives for recommendations to the current policies and determine what, if any further action is necessary.

**WHEREAS**, Section 7 of said Act requires the Commission to take certain action within thirty days from said public meeting,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED**, that this Commission declares and make its Final Order of Determination that the proposed improvement project is necessary and would be for the benefit of the public welfare and convenience, and that the proposed improvement project shall be made in accordance with the final specifications which are herewith adopted, a copy of which is attached to this Final Order of Determination.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** all of the statutory and procedural steps and requirements of Act 246 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1931, as amended have been compiled with pertaining to the following special assessment project:

A Work Session of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Kalamazoo County was held at the Road Commission office at 3801 East Kilgore Road, Kalamazoo, Michigan, on Tuesday, October 25, 2011. Commissioner McCauley called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m.

<u>Health Care Review</u> – Updated information was reviewed regarding the effective date of Public Act (PA) 152. The Board consensus was to implement the provision of Public Act 152 based upon the effective date for the first renewal on or after January 1, 2012, which for KCRC would be November 1, 2012.

Commissioner Berkebile noted he would like to choose the option that is most palatable to the employee, knowing that the Board has no choice but to implement either the flat-dollar or percentage share. Plan design options were discussed, premium share options were reviewed, and the Section 125 plan was discussed.

Commissioner Oscarson would like to know the effect of Section 125 plan on the typical employee. Finance Director Benison agreed to prepare and share that information.

The Board members would like a count of employee plan preference and have staff research/ask what are the obstacles to Preferred Plan Option (PPO)12 or PPO15 with Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA), understanding that these plan-design options are only available for non-union staff (8 total) and Kalamazoo Area Transportation Study (KATS) staff,. The Board gave staff the go-ahead to move forward with Section 125 plan, and it will be on next Board agenda for action.

Retiree insurance was discussed including plan design options and premium share. The Board would like staff to look at plan design changes for retirees so their contribution/monthly premium could remain the same. The Board also inquired if Road Commission retirees could have the same plans as General County and Community Mental Health retirees. It was noted that County Board recently approved increasing the retiree premium sharing to 16% (from 12%) effective 1/1/2012 for County retirees not eligible for Medicare. Staff shared with the Board that in both Teamsters Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) and personnel manual, language exists that says retiree health insurance benefits or the employer's contribution will not be greater than those provided to active employees. Therefore, when Public Act 152 is implemented, the retirees cost sharing will need to be reviewed for an increase accordingly.

Commissioner Berkebile moved, and it was seconded, to approve increasing the retiree premium sharing to 16% effective 1-1-2012. Staff will notify retirees of the increase as soon as possible. It was suggested that a press release also be developed for the same. In the notice of the 1/1/2012 increase from 8% to 16% retirees may also be informed of the potential 20% contribution including plan design changes that may be implemented to lessen the potential increase; however, no official action has been taken at this time relating to plan-design or 20% sharing.

<u>Purchasing Policy Review:</u> The Board suggested adding language allowing staff to purchase at auction or negotiated purchase, budgeted used capital equipment costing more than \$15,000. Commissioner Oscarson suggested the need for Testing Services be considered in the Professional Services policy. The Board's role in the Professional Services policy is at the pre-qualification step. The Board suggested wording changes in the last paragraph regarding the Request for Proposal (RFP) solicited from Request for Quote (RFQ) approved vendors. Staff will develop procedures to support these policies. No changes/suggestions to Sale or Disposal of Assets or Surplus policy.

Managing Director Johnson thanked the Board and asked if there are any other comments regarding the work session items.

Commissioner Moyle noted the Environmental Health Advisory Council was successful in getting drop boxes for household hazardous waste. The drop boxes will eliminate the need for paperwork and personnel involvement as the waste containers will be sent directly to the incinerators.

Commissioner McCauley attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the new Expo Center at the Kalamazoo Fair Grounds adding events are being booked for the Center. He reminded the Board of the County Road Association of Michigan (CRAM) legislative day on November 29<sup>th</sup> and the date time change for the next regular board meeting to Thursday December 8 at 7:30 a.m.

This Performance Resolution is required by the Michigan Department of Transportation for purposes of issuing to a municipal utility an "Individual Permit for Use of State Highway Right of Way," or an "Annual Application and Permit for Miscellaneous Operations Within State Highway Right of Way."

RESOLVED WHEREAS, the (city, village, township, etc.) hereinafter referred to as the "GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY," periodically applies to the Michigan Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the "DEPARTMENT," for permits, referred to as "PERMIT," to construct, operate, use and/or maintain utility or other facilities, or to conduct other activities, on, over, and under State Highway right of way at various locations; within and adjacent to its corporate limits;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the DEPARTMENT granting such PERMIT, the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY agrees that:

- 1. Each party to this Agreement shall remain responsible for any claims arising out of their own acts and/or omissions during the performance of this Agreement, as provided by law. This Agreement is not intended to increase either party's liability for, or immunity from, tort claims, nor shall it be interpreted, as giving either party hereto a right of indemnification, either by Agreement or at law, for claims arising out of the performance of this Agreement.
- 2. Any work performed for the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY will be solely as for the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY and not as a contractor or agent of the DEPARTMENT. The DEPARTMENT shall not be subject to any obligations or liabilities by vendors and contractors of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY, or their subcontractors or any other person not a party to the PERMIT without its specific prior written consent and notwithstanding the issuance of the PERMIT. Any claims against the State of Michigan, the Michigan Transportation Commission, the DEPARTMENT, and all officers, agents and employees thereof and those contracting governmental bodies performing permit activities for the DEPARTMENT and all officers, agents, and employees thereof will be the sole responsibility of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY.
- 3. The GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY shall take no unlawful action or conduct, which arises either directly or indirectly out of its obligations, responsibilities, and duties under the PERMIT which results in claims being asserted against or judgment being imposed against the State of Michigan, the Michigan Transportation Commission, the DEPARTMENT, and all officers, agents and employees thereof and those contracting governmental bodies performing permit activities for the DEPARTMENT and all officers, agents, and employees thereof, pursuant to a maintenance contract. In the event that the same occurs, for the purposes of the PERMIT, it will be considered as a breach of the PERMIT thereby giving the State of Michigan, the DEPARTMENT, and/or the Michigan Transportation Commission a right to seek and obtain any necessary relief or remedy, including, but not by way of limitation, a judgment for money damages.
- 4. The GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY It will, by its own volition and/or request by the DEPARTMENT, promptly restore and/or correct physical or operating damages to any State Highway Right of Way resulting from the installation construction, operation and/or maintenance of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY'S facilities according to a PERMIT issued by the DEPARTMENT.
- 5. With respect to any activities authorized by PERMIT, when the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY requires insurance on its own or its contractor's behalf it shall also require that such policy include as named insured the State of Michigan, the Transportation Commission, the DEPARTMENT, and all officers, agents, and employees thereof and those governmental bodies performing permit activities for the DEPARTMENT and all officers, agents, and employees thereof, pursuant to a maintenance contract.
- 6. The incorporation by the DEPARTMENT of this resolution as part of a PERMIT does not prevent he DEPARTMENT from requiring additional performance security or insurance before issuance of a PERMIT.

7. This resolution shall continue in force from this date until cancelled by the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY or the DEPARTMENT with no less than thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. It will not be cancelled or otherwise terminated by the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY with regard to any PERMIT which has already been issued or activity which has already been undertaken.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following position(s) are authorized to apply to the DEPARTMENT for the necessary permit to work within State Highway Right of Way on behalf of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY.
